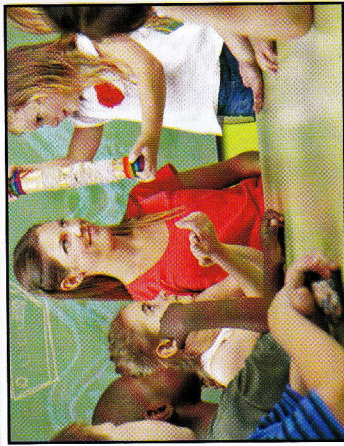




CDA 3: Providing an Environment for Learning \$45

Additionally it provides information regarding leading theories of child development.

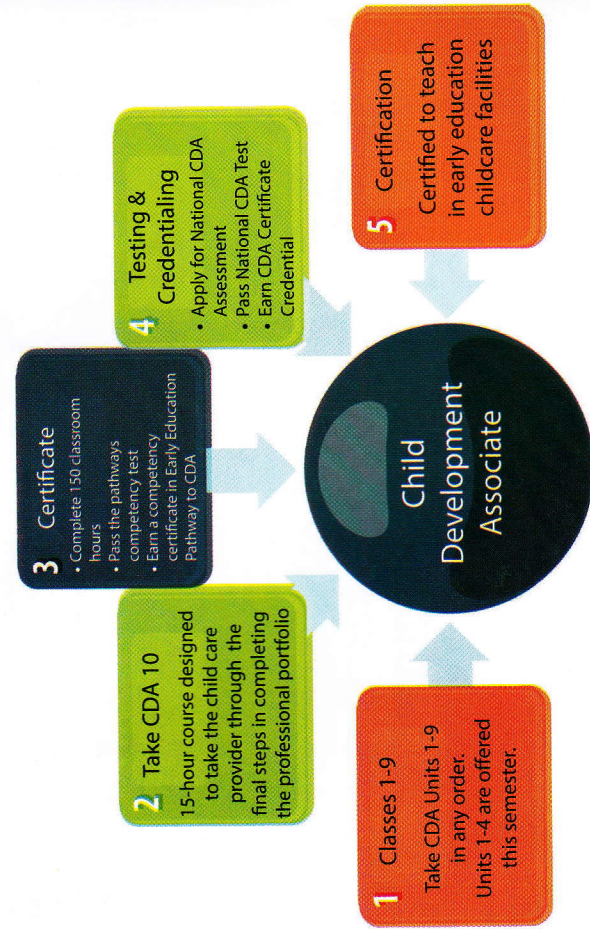
Certified Medication Aide (CMA)
The CMA course is designed for CNAs involved with the administration or distribution of medications. CNAs work with residents or clients in a long-term care facility, a facility for developmentally disabled, or a residential or adult day care facility.
*Must have 6 months working experience as a CNA.
**Must have a current CNA certification in LTC Home Health, or Developmentally Disabled in good standing with OSDH, HS Diploma or GED, and be 18 years old.

CMA * \$185

*Must have 6 months working experience as a CNA.

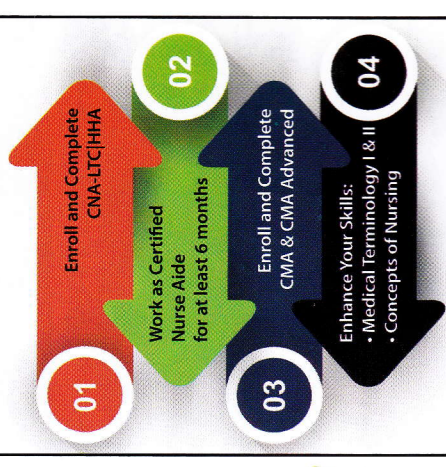
CMA-NG (Nasogastric/Inhaler) * \$60
